Parking at St Francis (Wolfville) - Did you know that you cannot park on bicycle lanes in the Province of Nova Scotia? The Nova Scotia's Motor Vehicle Act made it illegal to park on bicycle paths back in December of 2010. The penalties for parking in a bicycle lane are a Category A (including all court costs) offence:1st offence \$138.96; 2nd offence \$167.71; 3rd offence \$225.21. At St. Francis, Wolfville, the bike lane runs parallel to the church. We checked with the Town of Wolfville and were told that parking on the west side of Maple Avenue during Mass time would be acceptable.

This notice was approved by the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia NOTICE OF SETTLEMENT IN CLASS ACTION

To all individuals who were sexually abused by a priest of the Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of Halifax or Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of Yarmouth between April 14, 1954 and March 31, 2020 and have not previously settled or otherwise released either the Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of Halifax or Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of Yarmouth.

The Court has approved a settlement which provides compensation to eligible class members who file a claim for sexual assault and meet the requirements of the claims process.

If you opted out of the class action, the settlement will not impact you.

If you are part of the lawsuit as a Class Member, you can submit a claim for a payment of money as compensation. The amount of money that you may receive will depend on the specifics of the claim you submit. The potential amount of money to be paid to a Class Member whose claim is accepted will likely range from \$30,000 to \$350,000. Did You Know?

Pentecost - The Easter Season lasts for 50 days, ending with Pentecost (Greek pentekoste, "fiftieth"). Ranking second only to Easter, the feast of Pentecost must be understood in the context of the Jewish feast by the same name. Its other name in Jewish tradition is Feast of Weeks, a full season of 7 weeks of thanksgiving beginning with Passover Sabbath (see Tobit 2:1, 2 Maccabees 12:32). This prolonged festival celebrated the theme of harvest and thanksgiving. It evolved before the time of Christ into a memorial of the covenant and, by 300 AD, a memorial of the giving of the Law.

By the end of the 2nd century, Christians were observing a similar 50-day festival of rejoicing after the annual Pascha. People prayed standing, and fasting was prohibited. It seems that originally the followers of Jesus continued to observe the Jewish festival, a time of "first fruits" (see 1 Corinthians 16:8, 15:20,23) rather than a distinctly new theme. During these weeks, fasting and kneeling were forbidden because of the joyful experience of resurrection

By the late 4th century, the feast of the Ascension was some celebrated in some parts of the church on the 40th day after Easter (see Acts 1:3, 9-11). Originally, this mystery of the ending of Jesus' visible presence among his followers seems to have been observed as part of the outpouring of the Spirit on the 50th day, or Pentecost. For the first time, the original 50-day festival was broken.

Pentecost itself closes out the Easter season. It celebrates the overwhelming experience of God pouring out the Spirit upon the first community of those who believed Jesus was Lord and Christ (see Acts 2:1-4). Pentecost is called, therefore, the birth of the church or the birth of the church's mission.

The colour of vestments and decorations is red. It symbolizes the intense love and fire of the Holy Spirit. Other symbols of the Pentecost event are the dove (see Luke 3:21-22), the tongues of flame (see Acts 2:1-4), and wind (see Acts



Our Parish deserves a big pat on the back!

A hugely successful project saving literally hundreds of abandoned and lost children in India is now in its 13th year, and it was all started right here, in our parish, by folks from St. Anthony's (Berwick), St. Lawrence (Canning), St. Francis (Wolfville), St. John the Evangelist (Windsor), St. Joseph (Kentville) and St. Ambrose Co-Cathedral (Yarmouth) and then joined by others in Antigonish and Cape Breton. Nova Scotia thus became a founding member of an international ecumenical 'triangle', joining small clusters of supporters in Belgium and in Spain.

The Challenge: Veranasi is a holy Buddhist city in northern India and a major focus of Pilgrimage; as a result, it has 5 huge train stations with more than 200 trains arriving daily unloading tens of thousands of pilgrims! In the midst of such confusion, children sometimes get separated from their parents, and lost. They might be 4 or 5, grade school age, pre-teens, teenagers...'street kids' we would call them...left entirely on their own. For food they beg or do little jobs cleaning the train cars at the stations. Exhausted, they camp in nearby alleys or streets or in the trains in the RR yard. These 'Railway Children' lead a precarious and dangerous life.

The response: 14 years ago, Fr. Abhishiktanand ("Fr. Abhi"), an Indian Catholic priest, was sent to Nova Scotia to learn about Co-ops at the Coady Institute. There he met folks from the Valley, and came here to rest before returning home. Fr. Larry Pitcher accompanied him back to Veranasi, where they met Sr. Molly Pezhathinkal ("Sr. Manju") trying to help lost kids at one of the RR stations. Together they developed the idea of getting ahold of a space where those kids could sleep safely at night, and the on-going project of acquiring and running a 'Safe House' for the Railway Children of Veranasi was born. (Fr. Abhi is presently visiting NS and will concelebrate Mass with Fr. John this weekend in Kentville).

The Project has been going on now for over 13 years. Sometimes, after sheltering the children, they have been able to locate their families and reunite them. [They have become so skilled at this that now the police bring lost kids to them!] Sometimes they can find a family who will shelter them and arrange legal adoption. Sometimes the children become part of the 'family' living at the large Safe House which our offerings have provided. At any given time, it is home to 30+ girls; boys are housed separately with local supporters. Most of these children have never had a chance to go to school! [There are public schools in the area, but children have to have the money for their uniforms, books, supplies and lunches in order to attend.] We take care of all that, and safely get them there as well. It has been a huge success. One of the 1st girls to stay at the House in is now a fully registered nurse, and another is now in nursing school. To provide such an opportunity to an 'outcast' girl in India is a pearl beyond price.

Over the past decade, Nova Scotians have given \$345,000 to help Fr. Abhi and Sr. Manju get ahold of a large, solid house, hire wonderful staff and keep this dream alive. The work goes on; meanwhile, Fr. Abhi is with us for a week of much-needed rest. PS: The Bishops of Antigonish and Halifax-Dartmouth are both very supportive of their project.

A Nova Scotia Non-Profit Society, **Canadians for the Railway Children of India** (often known as **CRCIS**) operates to collect funds and transfer them safely and transparently to India. Note: The Society is not registered with Revenue Canada, and cannot issue income tax receipts.
