Knights of Columbus (Middleton) - Approx. 23.6 % of families in Kings County and 33.7% in Annapolis County live in poverty. Many low-income families have scarce resources to cover even the most basic essentials. These members of our community don't even have the funds to provide a Christmas dinner for their families. Last year the Knights of Columbus - Council 6297 provided over 200 Christmas meals for needy families in the Kingston, Greenwood, and Middleton schools. This year we have included Aylesford Elementary School in our mandate so we expect that number will rise to over 300 meals. As you can imagine that number of meals requires a lot of turkey (approx. 25 x 15 lbs.) The Annapolis Mess at CFB Greenwood has offered to cook and carve the turkey for us. Our Council is asking for donations of cash, gift cards or turkeys for this event. 

# **Christian Stewardship**

Item found in St Anthony's (Berwick) 25-year **Time Capsule** (recently opened)
Published on the 25<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time, Sept 20, 1998 in St Anthony's Weekly Bulletin

Imagine that you are standing in the middle of an empty field. You have nothing – absolutely nothing. Now God appears and God gives you piece by piece, everything that you possess – every piece of clothing you now own, every pair of shoes, every book, every dish, cup saucer, every pot and pan, all your appliances, every tape or CD, every piece of furniture, every item of food, your car or bicycle, everything. When God finishes giving all these things to you, He says to you: "Now take care of all these things because they do not belong to you. They belong to me. I am only lending them to you and if someone else needs what you have, and it is something you do not need, then give it to them freely. Remember that everyone is a brother or sister – treat them as a member of your family. My hope is that no one will ever go hungry or be without whatever they need to live in a human way. I'm counting on you to help me with this hope." Then God leaves.

This story is a real one. Everything we have is a gift. We are stewards of all that we possess. We are asked daily to use our possessions to benefit others. Then, when we finally come face to face with God, we will hear the words. "You have done well with all the gifts I gave to you. Come into our final home. All I have is now yours."

The Gospel today tells us: "No slave can serve two masters; for a slave with either hate the one and love the other or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth." The choice is ours. If we respond to the call of wealth and possessions, then we will limit our freedom to respond to God. If we respond to the call of God, then we become free to live and are able to reach out to others in love and offer them what they need to live. We become connected to others in a remarkable way. Then we will truly feel a part of the human family.

# **Living With Less Fear**

In virtually every instance in scripture where God appears within ordinary life, either through an angel, a special phenomenon, or through an appearance of the resurrected Christ, the first words are invariably: "Do not be afraid!" The soothing of fear, not its intensification, is the normal criterion that the voice we are hearing is coming from love.

We have many unconscious fears of God:

- that God is not as understanding and compassionate as we are.
- that God is not a big-hearted as we are.
- that God does not read the heart and cannot tell the difference between wound and coldness, immaturity, and sin.
- that God gives us only one chance and cannot bear any missteps and infidelities.
- that God doesn't respect our humanity, that God created us in one way but wants us to live in another way in order to be saved.
- that God is threatened by our doubts and questions, like an insecure leader.
- that God is less interested in our lives than we are and less solicitous for our salvation and that of our loved ones than we are.
- that God is as helpless before our moral helplessness as we are.

Here's a parable: Years ago, I was at the funeral of a young man who had died tragically in a car accident. At the time of his death, on the surface, his relationship to his church and to some of its moral teachings was far from ideal: He was not attending church regularly, was living with his girlfriend outside of marriage, was not much concerned about poor or the larger community, and was, in simple terms, partying pretty hard.

But everyone who knew him also knew of his essential goodness and his wonderful heart. There wasn't an ounce of malice in him, and heaven would be forever a less colorful and more impoverished place if he weren't there. At the reception following the church service, one of his aunts said to me: "He was such a good person, if I were running the gates of heaven, I would certainly let him in."

I assured her that, no doubt, God felt the same way, given that God's understanding and forgiveness infinitely surpass our own.
