CWL News - The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops has asked of the Catholic Women's League Canada to support Bill S-210: Protecting Young Persons from Exposure to Pornography Act. The House of Commons resumes on January 29, 2024 and this bill will come up for debate. Experts in child health indicate that the average age of first exposure to violent and degrading pornography is eleven years old, which contributes to sexual violence against women and addictive behaviors in youth. They advocate for age verification measures on pornography websites which Bill S-210 would pass into law. In its meeting with the federal government in February 2023, CWL Canada emphasized the protection of children and youth from access to pornography. Please consider signing a petition to be forwarded to our MP in support of this legislation. You may sign the petition at the entrance to the church (Middleton, Kentville & Annapolis Royal) or see Mary Crooks (St Monica's church hall), Ann Myers (St Joseph's) or Eloise Mailman (St Louis) or contact the office of your Member of Parliament, or write to your MP (no postage required). Thank you for helping to protect the development of our children to healthy youth and adults.

Pope Francis on Blessings

Recently the media have shared the news of Pope Francis allowing the clergy to bless same-sex couples. A Vatican document, *Fiducia Supplicans*, was released giving instruction and elaboration on the pastoral act of blessing. To help provide clarification **Archbishop Dunn** offers the following message:

On the Blessing of Same-sex Couples and Couples in Irregular Situations

The Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith issued a Declaration, approved by Pope Francis, stating that it is possible to bless same-sex couples but without any type of ritualization or offering the impression of a marriage. The doctrine regarding marriage does <u>not</u> change, and the blessing does <u>not</u> signify approval of the union. This gesture of pastoral closeness must avoid any elements that remotely resemble a marriage rite.


The document explores the theme of blessings, distinguishing between ritual and liturgical ones, and spontaneous ones more akin to signs of popular devotion. It is precisely in this second category there is now consideration of the possibility of welcoming even those who do not live according to the norms of Christian moral doctrine but humbly request to be blessed. The blessing does not officially validate their status nor change in any way the Church's perennial teaching on marriage.

The Declaration offers a pastoral understanding that those who ask for a blessing show themselves "to be in need of God's saving presence" in their lives by expressing "a petition for God's assistance, a plea to live better" (par. 21). Those who seek these blessings as acts of devotion "should not be required to have prior moral perfection" as a

precondition.

Most Rev. William McGrattan, Bishop of Calgary and the President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, has also released a statement where he points out that *Fiducia Supplicans* allows pastors to bless people who freely request a blessing, seeking divine help to live in fidelity to God's will. The Declaration makes clear that such blessings must be directed to the **persons themselves** rather than their **situation** and that they must be spontaneously requested and are not ritual or liturgical actions.
