In Corpus Christi Parish, we support both **Development & Peace** and **Chalice**. *Is there any difference in their focus? Yes.* 

**Development & Peace** is primarily dealing with "social justice" issues. How is the country/area in terms of the distribution of its wealth, opportunities, and privileges? Is the distribution "Christian"? Are the rights of individuals and the common good taken into account?

**Chalice** is more focused on "social aid and social service". It works with established Catholic religious communities to address directly the needs that are apparent in young people and their families (ie. food, education, shelter etc.)

Both are essential and they are difficult to compare. But we need to make the distinction.

**Archbishop Helder Camara** (1909-1999) of Brazil: "When I give food to the poor, they call me a saint. When I ask why they are poor, they call me a communist."

# **Our Daily Bread**

When Moses prays to God, "Yahweh, feed these people," Yahweh replies, "I will feed them. I will let manna drop from heaven but they are to pick up only enough to feed themselves for one day." (Exodus 16:4)

The whole message of the desert is a message of continual dependence on God, minute by minute, learning to trust in Providence. Some of them want to store up the manna in order to have some for tomorrow. They want to plan for the future, and allay their fears. Moses says, "No! Only enough for today. Yahweh will give you your daily bread." But some kept an excess for the following day, and it bred maggots and it smelt foul. (Exodus 16:20)

Instead we say, "Give us this day our daily bread." How strange these words sound to people with savings accounts, insurance policies, and three-year warranties, even on their toasters!

# The Security To Be Insecure



Imagine walking in a darkened room. We put our hands in front of us, afraid we are going to bump into a piece of furniture or slip on a rug. We walk very slowly. This is very much what God calls us to on the journey of faith.

It's not easy, because we want to have our pathway illuminated in front of us. We want to know where, how, why we're going. Faith, though, is the security to be insecure. Our trust is in God and not in our own cleverness. It's not in our ingenuity, our planning, our personality, status, money.

The desert is the place where all of the false names for God are taken away from us. The storehouses are always empty. It is the time for learning total dependence on God, minute by minute. What happens in the desert? We will constantly experience a new name for God, like the Hebrews did. God always has a new face.
